
Year 5 - Term 3 - Curriculum Letter

What another brilliant term in Year 5, with Highwayman Performances, a visit to St. Andrews Church and Piety Mosque, supporting local charities and lots of festive fun! We hope you all have a wonderful Christmas break with your loved ones and that you stay safe during the festive period.

Throughout Term 2, we learned about 'Ancient Greece' in History, explored different forces and how they act upon objects in Science and studied Ancient Greek pottery in Art. Next term, Year 5 will begin their 'Biomes' study with a focus on Geography. This area of study provides children the opportunity to build on their understanding of physical geography, building on their knowledge from Term One. The children will gain insight into the key features of different biomes, their different flora and fauna and discuss the threats they face.

In **Geography**, we'll be learning to:

- Describe and understand key aspects of physical geography including climate zones and biomes.
- Explore weather patterns around parts of the world.
- Identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude,
 Equator, Norther Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere



In Term 3, the children will have the opportunity to visit the Eden Project to enrich their learning about Biomes.

In **English**, the children's writing will be based on the genres of 'Myths' and 'Information Reports' where they will build their understanding through a series of core texts. In their **Whole Class Reading** sessions, the children will be studying 'Who let the gods out' by Maz Evans in 5EP and 'The Girl of ink and stars' by Kiran Millwood Hargarve in 5RS.

Then in **Maths**, the children will be studying Fractions including decimals and percentages before moving on to building their understanding of Multiplication and Division. Finally, in **Science**, the children will be exploring 'Properties and Change in Materials'.


