

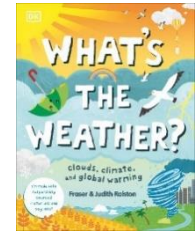

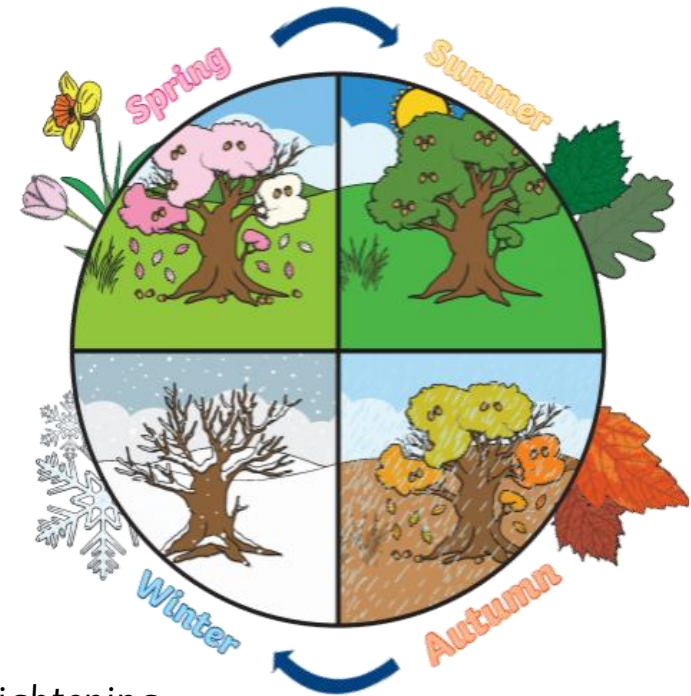

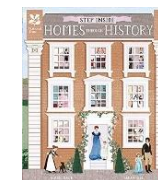
Key Vocabulary	
seasons	The year is separated into 4 seasons by the type of weather and daylight hours; spring, summer, autumn and winter.
weather	It describes the condition of the air at a particular place and time.
climate	It is the usual pattern of weather a place will get.
forecast	A prediction of weather based on scientific observation and evidence.
precipitation	Water that falls to earth in rain, snow, hail, sleet or mist.
rainfall	The amount of precipitation that falls at one point.
orbit	The regular repeating path the Earth takes around the sun.



Did you know?
 The longest day of the year is called the Summer Solstice and the shortest day of the year is the Winter Solstice.

Isambard Kingdom Brunel was a significant engineer in the **Victorian** times. He built bridges, ships and even railway stations.

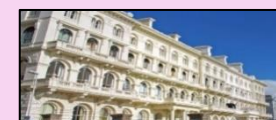
