<u>Year 5 – Term 5 – Curriculum Letter</u>

We have had another fantastic term in Year 5, where we have been able to build and develop our key knowledge across the curriculum. We have celebrated many whole school events such as World Book Day, Red Nose Day, and our Annual Easter Community event which were enjoyable for all. We hope you have a wonderful Easter break and look forward to you joining us again on **Monday 15th April** for the first day of Term 5.


Throughout Term 5, we learned about 'Roman Britain' in History, explored 'Properties of Materials' in Science, and developed our 'painting and stitching' skills in Art. Next term, Year 5 will begin their 'Migration' learning in Geography where the children will learn about how different peoples move around the globe and some of the factors that lead people to make these movements. The children will build on their previous knowledge and understand the role that climate plays in affecting this migration, particularly the process of desertification.

In Geography, we'll be learning to

- Recognise that people have differing qualities of life in different locations, and explore how these differences can lead to migration.
- Differentiate between economic and climactic factors and explore their differing roles in driving migration.

In **English**, the children's writing will be based on the genre of 'Diary Writing' and 'Poetry,' where they will build their understanding through a series of core texts. In their **Whole Class Reading** sessions, the children will be studying 'The Girl of Ink and Stars' in 5EP and 'Kick' in 5RS.

Then in **Maths**, the children will be revisiting and building upon their knowledge by learning about Decimals and then they will move on to learning about properties of shape. Finally, in **Science**, the children will be exploring Living things and their habitats. This will allow them to build on their knowledge from Key Stage One.
